

LESSONS LEARNED FROM RAPIDLY EXPANDING MAJOR WILDLAND FIRES

THE UNITED STATES HAS SEEN AN INCREASE IN RAPIDLY EXPANDING & DEVASTATING WILDFIRES OVER THE LAST DECADE. IN THESE EXTREME CIRCUMSTANCES, LOCAL, STATE, AND FEDERAL RESOURCES NEED TO BE ABLE TO WORK TOGETHER. THIS PRESENTATION WILL INCREASE YOUR ABILITY TO OPERATE IN AN ALL-RISK, RAPIDLY DEVELOPING EMERGENCY, WHERE LEADER'S INTENT AND APPROPRIATE ACTION MUST BE UNDERSTOOD. THE PRESENTATION IS GEARED TOWARDS PERSONNEL FILLING COMMAND LEVEL ROLES IN FIRE, LAW, EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT, AND DISPATCH.

CAL FIRE BATTALION CHIEF MARSHALL TURBEVILLE WAS BORN AND RAISED IN SONOMA COUNTY, ENTERING THE FIRE SERVICE WHEN SONOMA COUNTY'S "FIRE SEASON" WAS THREE MONTHS LONG. HE WILL COORDINATE A TWO-DAY PRESENTATION OF SONOMA COUNTY COMMAND LEVEL FIRST RESPONDERS WHO WERE INVOLVED IN SONOMA COUNTY WILDFIRES, WITH A FOCUS ON LESSONS LEARNED FROM, AND IMPROVEMENTS SINCE 2017. THIS WILL BE THE FIRST TIME THESE RESPONDERS HAVE COME TOGETHER TO SHARE THEIR STORY.
